"The Company's performance in the first quarter exceeded our expectations and the quarter was characterised by continued organic growth. The increase in income amounted to 21% between years, with passenger revenues up by 31%. The number of passengers increased both on international flights and on regional flights. The great increase in number of tourist travelling to Iceland had a positive impact on tourism services.

At the beginning of the year we issued an EBITDA forecast for 2012, where we projected EBITDA in the range of USD 90-98 million. Since then the trends in operating conditions have mostly been positive. Based on current assumptions, EBITDA for the year is now projected at USD 100-105 million."

TRANSPORT FIGURES

- Passengers on international flights totalled 305 thousand, increasing by 18%
- The 75.4% load factor on international flights in the first quarter was the highest first-quarter figure in the Company's history
- A redelivery check of one cargo aircraft resulted in lower fleet utilisation and fewer sold block hours in leasing projects

The capacity on international flights increased by 11% between years in the first quarter, while the number of passengers increased by 18% over the same period. The number of passengers increased in all of the Company's markets, with the greatest increase in the tourist market to Iceland, at 31% between years. The 75.4% passenger load factor was the highest first-quarter figure in the Company's history, representing an increase of 4.3 percentage points from the preceding year.

Passengers on regional flights and flights to Greenland numbered over 80 thousand over the quarter, increasing by 5% from the same period of the preceding year. The load factor was 70.7%, up by 1.6 percentage points between years. Fleet utilisation amounted to 87.1% in charter projects and decreased by 8 percentage points. The reduced utilisation resulted from a redelivery check of one cargo aircraft. The number of sold block hours in charter flights over the period fell between years for



the same reason. The number of sold hotel room nights increased substantially in the first quarter, by 33%. The room utilisation also increased substantially and was 61.8%, as compared to 52.5% in the first quarter of last year.

FIRST QUARTER OPERATIONS

EBITDA was negative by USD 3.0 million, down by USD 1.4 million between years. The **EBITDA** ratio was -1.9% in the first quarter, as compared to -1.2% over the same period in 2011. The EBITDA exceeded the Company's expectations, with the increase largely explained by higher passenger revenue. EBIT was USD -16.7 million, as compared to USD -11.7 million at the same time last year. **Losses after taxes** amounted to USD 13.2 million, as compared to a loss of USD 9.1 million in the corresponding period of 2011. **EBITDAR** amounted to USD 11.1 million, as compared to USD 12.9 million in the first quarter of 2011. The **EBITDAR** ratio was 7.1%, as compared to 9.9% at the same time last year.

Transport revenue increased by USD 20.4 million, or 29%; revenue from passenger transport increased by ISK 19.3 billion, or 31%. Passenger numbers increased significantly over the quarter, with the increase in international flights at 18% and in regional flights at 5%. **Charter revenue** fell by USD 1.5 million. In light of the reduced projects in charter cargo flights, one cargo aircraft was returned. The Company currently has two aircraft engaged in this work, but there are plans to cut these operations still further and reduce the number of aircraft to one later in the year. **Other operating revenue** increased by USD 8.2 million, as compared to the first quarter of 2011, or by 29%. The primary reason is the increase in revenue from sold tourism service between years. The number of tourists visiting Iceland at this time of year has grown substantially, with the first-quarter growth at 31%, as compared to the first quarter of last year.



EXPENSES

- Total expenses increased by USD 28.5 million
- Cost increases largely a result of the increased capacity on international flights
- All advertising, booking and introduction costs resulting from the increased peakseason capacity was expensed in the course of the quarter

Salaries and related expenses increased by USD 4.7 million, or 12%, in comparison with the first quarter of 2011. This is explained by the increased capacity, combined with the impact of contractual wage increases between years.

Fuel cost increased by USD 9.5 million, which represents an increase of 33% from the preceding year. The direct cost increase resulting from price hikes in the quarter was USD 5.3 million, while the increase in fuel cost resulting from production increases was USD 3.7 million.

Aircraft and aircrew lease increased in comparison with the first quarter of 2011, by 2%.

Aircraft handling, landing and communication expenses increased by USD 1.3 million between years, as a result of the increase in capacity and general price hikes. Aircraft maintenance expenses amounted to USD 12.2 billion, remaining more or less unchanged year-on-year. Other operating expenses amounted to USD 38.0 million, increasing by USD 12.6 million between years. Of this figure, USD 4.6 million resulted from allowances for bad debt. Other items that increased between years were tourism expenses owing to the increase in the number of tourists to Iceland, in addition to items relating to increased passenger revenues, such as booking fees, credit card expenses and commission expenses. All expenses accruing during the quarter and relating to the increased peakseason operations of the year, such as advertising, market initiatives, introduction of aircraft and booking, were expensed in the course of the quarter.

NET FINANCIAL INCOME

Net financial expenses amounted to USD 0.1 million, down by USD 3.6 million

Financial expenses in the first quarter amounted to USD 3 million, down by USD 0.5 million between years. The currency effect over the quarter was positive in the amount of USD 2.5 million. Owing to the weight of the króna in the balance sheet, its weakening against the US dollar resulted in a currency gain during the quarter.

Operating assets amounted to USD 483.9 million compared to USD 483.0 million from the beginning of the year. The Company's largest asset is its fleet of aircraft. At the end of the quarter the Company's fleet comprised a total of 37 aircraft, of which 22 were owned. The table below provides an overview of the Company's aircraft at the end of the first quarter.

Equity amounted to a total of USD 241.3 million at the end of the first quarter, and the equity ratio was 31%, up from the end of the first quarter of 2011, when it amounted to 30%. Although dividend payments were made in in April they are accounted for in Q1 as they were approved on the Annual General Meeting in March. At year-end 2011 the equity ratio was 36%.

Interest-bearing debt amounted to USD 171.2 million, as compared to USD 196.9 million at the beginning of the year. Repayment of long-term borrowings in the first quarter amounted to USD 25.7 million; of that figure repayment in the amount of USD 14.6 million were made on loans that were not yet due.

Cash and marketable securities amounted to a total of USD 145.6 million at the end of the first quarter of 2012, as compared to USD 106.7 million at the beginning of the year. **Net interest-bearing debt** therefore amounted to USD 25.6 million at the end of the quarter, down by USD 64.6 million from the turn of the year.

Net cash from operating activities in the first quarter amounted to USD 86.1 million, up by USD 16.1 million as compared to the first quarter of 2011. **Investments in operating assets** amounted to USD 21.0 million. Investments in one Boeinig 757-200 aircraft and aircraft components amounted to USD 9.5 million, and in introduction cost for two Dash 8-200 aircraft totalled USD 2.5 million. Investments in engine hours amounted to USD 3.3 million over the period. **Investments in long-term expenses** amounted to USD 2.0 million, of which investments in leased engines amounted to USD 1.9 million. Repayment on long-term borrowings amounted to USD 25.7 over the quarter. Cash increased by USD 47.9 million over the quarter. The increase over the corresponding period last year amounted to USD 26.5 million.

OUTLOOK FOR ICELANDAIR GROUP HF.

- Continued organic growth
- Updated assumptions indicate EBITDA in the range of USD 100-105 million in 2012

The year got off to a good start, and the number of passengers increased significantly in the first three months. The seat load factor increased significantly, both on international flights and on regional flights. Icelandair Group will continue to focus on reducing the seasonal fluctuations in Icelandic tourist services with the aim of increasing still further the number of travellers outside the peak season.

In 2012, the 75th anniversary year of the Company, the most extensive flight schedule in its history will be in place. A new year-round destination, Denver, Colorado, will be added to the international route network, and at the same time the frequency of flights to various cities in the United States and Europe will increase. The number of destinations will be 31, and it is projected that the Company's passengers on international flights should number about 2 million over the year, which represents a 15% increase over 2011. The route network, which is based on three markets, the domestic market in Iceland, the tourist market to Iceland and the international market between Europe and North America, offers flexibility and opportunities to increase the seat capacity and number of passengers in excess of the average growth in this region of the world.

Our hotel operation is growing and Icelandair Group recently opened a new hotel, Icelandair Hotel Reykjavik Marina, with 108 rooms, and well situated by the harbour in downtown Reykjavik. Our regional flight operation which also operates flights to Greenland is improving its results and the capacity to Greenland will be increased during the year.

The position of the Company's fuel hedging at the end of March is illustrated in the table on the following page. The table shows that 32% of the projected use in April to December 2012 has been hedged through contracts. In addition to contractual hedging, the Company has defined the interaction



of EUR/USD and oil prices as an internal risk hedge. Thus, the Company assumes that the efficiency of natural fuel risk hedges will be 13% on the average in 2012.

The IATA report published last April indicates that 2012 will be a challenging year for airline operations in the world in spite of increased optimism regarding demand. Reduced profitability is assumed in the sector owing to the continued high fuel prices and uncertainty regarding price development. The Board of Directors of Icelandair Group is of the opinion that the Company is well positioned to face these challenging external circumstances owing to the flexibility of the Group's operations, its strong balance sheet and continued organic growth.

At the beginning of the year Icelandair Group issued an EBITDA forecast for 2012, which assumed an EBITDA of USD 90-98 million. Since then the trends in operating conditions have mostly been positive. Based on current assumptions, EBITDA for the year as a whole is now projected at USD 100-105 million. The assumptions for that forecast (for the period April – December) is a EUR/USD exchange rate of 1.30 and fuel prices of 1.080 (excluding hedging) per ton.

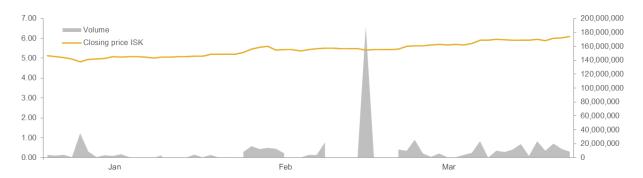
SHAREHOLDERS

The market value of the Company was ISK 30.5 billion at the end of the first quarter of 2012. The closing price at the end of the quarter was ISK 6.10 per share. The highest closing price was ISK 6.10 per share, while the lowest was ISK 4.83 per share and the average closing price was ISK 5.43 per share. The number of issued shares on 31 March 2012 was 5,000,000,000 and the number of outstanding shares at the same time was 4,974,540,000. The price of the Company's shares went up by 21% in the first quarter of 2012, and the number of shareholders at year-end was 1,354.
